

PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE STREETLIGHT UPGRADE PROJECT

(from 2nd Street SE to 14th Street SE)



PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Pennsylvania Avenue Streetlight Upgrade Project was designed to improve existing streetlights and traffic signals along Pennsylvania Avenue SE and will provide a fully operational and functional street lighting system once complete. The project limits extend from 2nd Street SE to 14th Street SE Pennsylvania Avenue and is in Ward 6, Washington, D.C.

The streetlight and traffic signal upgrades will improve overall lighting and enhance transit safety for vehicular traffic, cyclists, and pedestrians, as well as bus operation and local business foot traffic along the project corridor. Pennsylvania Avenue is considered a historic street, as stated in the District of Columbia Streetlight Policy Guidelines, requiring special treatment in the lighting and operations of the avenue.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The Pennsylvania Avenue SE Streetlight Upgrade Project will improve roadway lighting and traffic signals, creating a safer environment for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists. This project was designed to improve/implement the following:

- Cobra head lighting fixtures and pendant post
- LED luminaires
- Enhanced lighting distribution
- Upgraded traffic signals along project corridor
- Improved roadway safety for pedestrians, motorists and cyclists
- ADA compliant intersections
- DDOT and AASHTO streetlight policy guidelines

PROJECT TIMELINE

Length of Project: Approximately 20 Months, weather permitting

Daytime construction hours: 9:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. Monday–Friday

Weekend work hours: as required and approved by DDOT in accordance with noise ordinance restrictions.
